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Requirements

- Combine risk factors to generate a risk factor for each sub population
- Show risks of subpopulations
 - Teens
 - Young Adults
 - Middle aged people
 - Elderly

Fact Sheet: Risk factors

This Fact Sheet identifies the key 'trigger' or risk factors that can cause loneliness and social isolation in older age. These factors can be used to help to identify those likely to be at risk or experiencing loneliness in a community.

Based on the research that has been conducted about loneliness and isolation amongst older people we know that there are an array of risk factors or triggers, including:

Personal circumstances:

- Living alone¹
- Being single, divorced, never married²
- Living on a low income³
- Living in residential care⁴

Transitions:

- Bereavement⁵
- Becoming a carer or giving up caring⁶
- Retirement⁷

Personal characteristics:

- Aged 75 plus⁸
- From an ethnic minority community⁹
- Being gay or lesbian¹⁰

Health and disability:

- Poor health¹¹
- Immobility¹²
- Cognitive impairment¹³
- Sensory impairment¹⁴
- Dual sensory impairment¹⁵

Geography i.e. living in an area:

- With high levels of material deprivation¹⁶
- In which crime is an issue¹⁷

- Immigrant or first generation
- In care
- Abuse
- Low socio economic group
- Child carers
- +other factors

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- ❑ Weighting variables together to generate a cumulative risk model for subpopulations across the UK
 - ❑ Investigate the use of outcome measures to adjust weights

Possible data sources Risk

Traditional data sources

- Community life survey
- Census data
 - Number of people per household (living alone
Single parents)
 - Age of arrival in the UK
 - Births to non UK born Mothers
- HHFCE - Income to rent ratio
- Official Labour market statistics
 - Employment / carer status

Possible data sources Risk

Amenities

- Proximity to Sports Centres
- Transport Links
- Playgroups
- Registered childcares
- Number of libraries
- Number of pubs/ restaurants
- Social media data traffic
 - Support groups by region (mumsnet, meetups)
 - Local Facebook social groups (by age and group type)

Possible data sources Risk

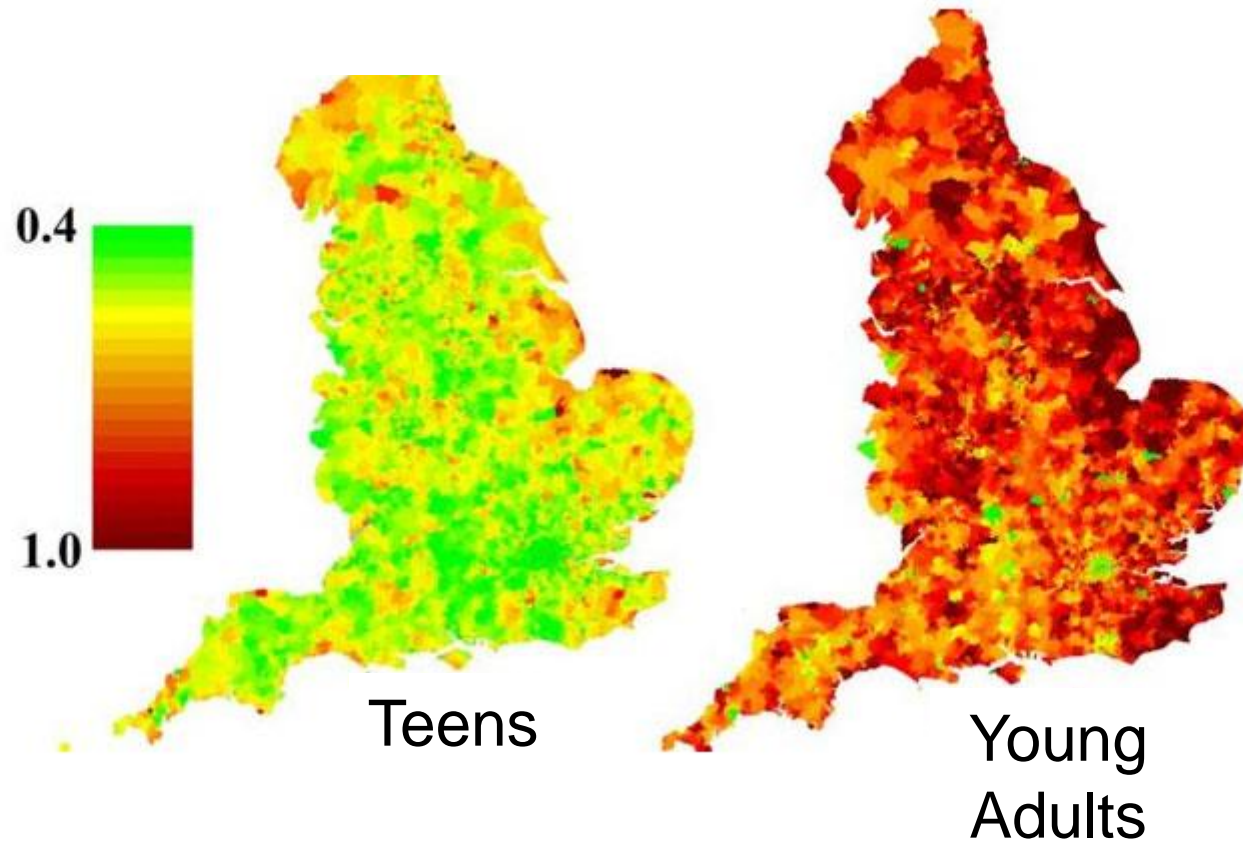
Geography

- Population density
- Pollution
- Weather
- Public green space (Sceanicness index? [Warwick])

Possible data sources Outcome

- Existing ONS measures of Loneliness
- Depression, high blood pressure, Antibiotic prescriptions, and other loneliness related diseases (Health Data)
- Divorce Rates
- Causes of death (age/ Loneliness related diseases)
- Sickness absence totals

Map risks- Could provide breakdown of why risk is high or low within a region?
