# 1) Attributing Frequencies to Windstorm Event Scenarios

#### Data

- Tropical cyclone track set International Best Track Archive for Climate Stewardship (IBTrACS) <u>https://www.ncdc.noaa.gov/ibtracs/</u> Can be accessed - csv file (~500MB), 200 columns, ~400k rows. Recently collected data appears more useful/precise
- Example hypothetical tracks and portfolios could be created beforehand, if useful.

- Water stress indicators:
  - Normalized Difference Vegetation Index (NDVI) & Enhanced Vegetation Index (EVI): Data from the website <u>https://resourcewatch.org/data/explore</u> user guides suggests data for vegetation conditions, temperature and vegetation health from 1981. (we guess you can open .nc files with matlab)
  - Water Requirement Satisfaction Index (WRSI)
  - The World Resources Institute (WRI) 'Resource Watch' data platform https://resourcewatch.org/data/explore, for example:
    - Average aridity, calculated as the ratio of mean annual precipitation to mean annual potential evapotranspiration (source: CGIAR-CSI)

### • Conflict databases:

- Armed Conflict Location & Event Data Project (ACLED) data-set.
  - https://www.acleddata.com/data/
  - Data available on ACLED website as Excel spreadsheets. Highly unstructured (text descriptions of conflict events) - may be difficult to work with.
  - Disaggregated conflict collection with information on the dates, actors, types of violence, locations, and fatalities of all reported political violence and protest events across Africa, South Asia, South East Asia and the Middle East. Political violence and protest includes events that occur within civil wars and periods of instability, public protest and regime breakdown
  - Updated weekly
  - Africa records from 1997 to present day
- Uppsala Conflict Data Program (UCDP)
  - UCDP data accessible via REST API (so can be downloaded directly into R, Python, etc.)
