The purpose of this coursework is (a) to learn how to use traceroute and interpret its output to discover the shape of some of the Internet; and (b) do this by discovering and using the various tools available that document the Internet.

- 1. Use traceroute to various UK Universities to discover, as far as possible, how each of the regional academic networks is connected to JANET.
- 2. Use traceroute to various Canadian Universities to discover, as far as possible, how each is connected to the Internet.

To help with this you should find and use tools that help you interpret the data that traceroute provides.

You should hand in, via Moodle, your answers for each part, together with any extra information you feel will clarify your answers.

You should hand in a PDF of your report: not DOC or DOCX or other variant.

Notes

- Versions of traceroute are available online from various sources; you may use your own, if it works. Make sure all your traces start from the same point
- The phrase "as possible" means "as possible within the time constraints of this assignment"
- Not all routers respond very informatively to traceroute packets, especially when heavily loaded, so try to do this at relatively quiet times (note that "quiet" in Canada is not the same as "quiet" in the UK)
- Use your judgement on the number of traceroutes you run: if you blast out hundreds some hosts might interpret this as an attack.

Assessment Criteria

- A good solution will be a correct depiction of the relevant topology, with complete supporting evidence and discussion of the quality of the tools you have used,
- A passing solution will substantially correct depiction of the relevant topology, with some supporting evidence,
- A poor to failing solution will show little evidence of interpreting the traceroute output successfully.
